Founded in 1913, it offers programs for Spanish-speaking children, primarily from Juarez, to attend high school in the United States and attend an American undergraduate university. All high school classes are taught in English.

#### **METHODIST HOME WACO**

Methodist Children's Home (MCH) mission is to offer hope to children, youth and families through a nurturing, Christian community. Founded in 1890, MCH is a nationally accredited, nonprofit childcare ministry. MCH serves children and youth through residential programs on the Waco campus and Boys Ranch, and through foster care, transition services and a variety of services in communities throughout Texas and New Mexico.

#### **PROVIDENCE PLACE SAN ANTONIO**

Providence Place has been in existence since 1895 and provides services to several different populations with specific challenges. These include adult survivors of human trafficking, adults with disabilities, women facing an unplanned pregnancy, families with children under the age of three and children and youth in foster care. We provide education, job search and therapeutic services to move individuals beyond day to day survival. We want everyone to have the opportunity to envision a different future and transform their story.



### **Connectional/Missional Giving also known as Apportionments**

We have been highlighting each of the funds that make up the Connectional/ Missional Giving since April. We have covered World Service Fund, the General Administration Fund, Africa University Fund, Interdenominational Cooperation Fund, Ministerial Education Fund and this month we will cover the **Black College** 

**Fund.** The 11 U.S. historically Black colleges and universities supported by The United Methodist Church have played a unique role in U.S. higher education. Their graduates—teachers and doctors, ministers and bishops, judges, artists and entrepreneurs—are leaders in the African-American community and in a rapidly changing, more diverse United States.

Communion Rail Offerings in October through December and the Christmas Offering will go our Connectional/Missional Giving in the Central Texas Conference of the United Methodist Church. We plan to pay out 100% of our responsible amount for 2024.

This year the amount we are to pay for Connectional/Missional Giving is \$40,775.00. As of August 31, 2024, we have paid \$8,308.07 and the amount remaining to pay out is \$32,466.73. If you have any questions on this, please get with Laurie in the church office.
