As we approach Thanksgiving, as the leaves change and fall, and as temperatures drop, I wanted to take a moment to write about apportionments. Apportionments, or connectional missional giving, is the money that every United Methodist church is obligated to give to the denomination. There is a formula that determines how much each church is asked to give. Our apportionments this year are \$40,775.00. So far, we have given \$9,758.27. The Leadership Team of this church has generously agreed to pledge up to \$15,000 and has

challenged the congregation to match this amount. This is a wonderful idea, but what has become clear to me is that we need to change the way we handle our apportionments because apportionments are important.

Our connectional giving is a vital part of who we are as United Methodists; it always has been. Our apportionments remind us that we are in ministry with over 10,000,000 other United Methodists worshipping in almost 40,000 churches across the world. Our connectional giving connects us with millions of other followers of Jesus who are seeking the loving, just and free world that God imagines for all people.

The United Methodist Church is a connectional church, because we know that we are stronger together! It is time that City Point UMC reprioritizes our connectional giving. Next year, we will have two churchwide fundraisers to raise money for our apportionments. As long as I serve this church, we will never again enter November owing three-quarters of our connectional obligation.

As for this year, you are invited to give to our apportionments every Communion Sunday through our Communion rail offering. Additionally, throughout December, we will have baskets set out in the sanctuary to receive special offerings which will go toward our apportionments. I thank you in advance for your generosity, and I look forward to entering a future with all of you where our apportionments are no longer an afterthought but are an integral part of who we are.

Founded in 1913, it offers programs for Spanish-speaking children, primarily from Juarez, to attend high school in the United States and attend an American undergraduate university. All high school classes are taught in English.

Founded in 1890, MCH is a nationally accredited, nonprofit childcare ministry. PROVIDENCE PLACE SAN ANTONIO

Providence Place has been in existence since 1895 and provides services to several different populations with specific challenges. These include adult survivors of human trafficking, adults with disabilities, women facing an unplanned pregnancy, families with children under the age of three and children and youth in foster care. We provide education, job search and therapeutic services to move individuals beyond day to day survival. We want everyone to have the opportunity to envision a different future and transform their story.

Connectional/Missional Giving also known as Apportionments

We have been highlighting each of the funds that make up the Connectional/ Missional Giving since April. We have covered World Service Fund, the General Administration Fund, Africa University Fund, Interdenominational Cooperation Fund, Ministerial Education Fund, Black College Fund and this month we will cover

the last of the different funds that make up the apportionments with the **Episcopal Fund**. Bishops are an integral part of the spiritual and administrative leadership of the church. The Episcopal Fund pays for bishops' salaries, office and travel expenses, and pension and health-benefit coverage.

Communion Rail Offerings in October through December and the Christmas Offering will go to our Connectional/Missional Giving in the Central Texas Conference of the United Methodist Church. We plan to pay out 100% of our responsible amount for 2024.

This year the amount we are to pay for Connectional/Missional Giving is \$40,775.00. As of October 31, 2024, we have paid \$9,758.27 and the amount remaining to pay out is \$31,016.73. If you have any questions on this, please get with Laurie in the church office.
